The DC07 range uses the most advanced cyclone technology to maintain the highest constant suction. The DC07 has many unique features which include quick and hygienic bin emptying, a fully reversible wand, a new sliding wand cap and a quick-draw hose. The DC07 contains a lifetime pre-motor filter, and a lifetime HEPA post-motor filter that is designed to retain the highest level of microscopic dust particles and allergens.






1.5 Using DC07



To start vacuuming, push cleaner head down with foot and pull handle towards you.

Ensure the machine is in the upright position before using the tools.

Press the wand release catch to release the wand and hose. Slide back the wand cap to place tools directly onto the wand handle.



After releasing the wand from the hose, the tools will fit directly onto the hose. The wand can be reversed to fit onto the hose. The tools then fit onto the end of the wand.

1.6 Emptying the Clear bin™

The bin must be emptied when dirt reaches the **MAX** mark.

Press the cyclone release catch to remove the bin assembly.



Option 1 (recommended for asthma/allergy sufferers).

Wipe outside of clear bin with a damp cloth before emptying. Place bin in a bag and pull bin emptying trigger to empty dust into bag. Let dust settle and close bag.



Option 2

Empty directly into a garbage can.

Ensure bin base is closed securely and replace bin assembly onto machine.



Cleaning the bin and shroud

Ensure bin is empty and bin base is open. Press bin release catch to remove the bin.





Clean shroud with cloth or dry brush to remove lint and debris.



To reassemble the clear bin, place on the floor with the bin base closed. Holding the carry handle, put the cyclone assembly inside the clear bin,


line up the front and rear catches and push down to click the catches into place.



Ensure the clear bin is secure before replacing on the machine.

1.7 Washing the lifetime pre-motor filter

Press filter release catch and remove filter housing from machine.



Remove filter from housing. Wash only the blue foam and yellow cage in cold water until the water runs clear.



Leave in a warm place to dry for approx. 12 hours. Replace filter in housing and click back into machine.





2.1 Electrical safety testing

On completion of all repairs, the product must be tested to ensure that it conforms to safety standards. This is vital to avoid any possibilities of personal injury to the end user.





Disconnect the machine from the electrical outlet at all times during repair and test. Failure to do so could result in electric shock or personal injury.

- 1. Plug the machine into an insulation tester, or bond the live and neutral of the plug using the black crocodile clip.
- 2. Ensure the product switch is in the 'ON' position.
- 3. Remove the pre-filter housing assembly.
- 4. Connect the red crocodile clip to a terminal screwdriver. Insert the screwdriver into the motor retainer until there is contact with the motor fancase (Fig. 1). Press and hold the test button and note the final reading.
- 5. Remove the cyclone top/bin assembly.
- 6. Connect the red probe to the switch housing screw (Fig. 2). Press and hold the test button and note the final reading.




A Dyson minimum insulation resistance of 3 $M\Omega$ must be obtained. If this minimum insulation is not reached the product is unsafe. Any unsafe products that are not repaired must be clearly labelled to indicate that the product is unsafe and should not be used. This information must be recorded on the repair sheet.


Remove the cyclone and the bin assembly from the main body. Release the wand catch and remove the wand assembly from the hose, then detach the hose from the main body. Remove the pre-filter housing assembly.




Squeeze the release catches to remove the valve pipe assembly. Release the three catches on the post filter lid using a thin, flat bladed screwdriver. Remove the post filter lid and post filter.









